AMERICAN PLATFORM TENNIS ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF THE 1971 ANNUAL MEETING

The 38th Annual Meeting of the American Platform Tennis Association was held at the Princeton Club, New York City, at 5:30 p.m. on November 1, 1971.

The meeting was attended by 128 people.

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

Paul C. Melloy, President, welcomed the group to the meeting.

It was unanimously agreed that the reading of the minutes of the last annual meeting be waived.

Mr. Molloy stated that, "The last two years as President have been great ones for me. I have been fortunate to have a real good committee to work with - Thistle, Brown, Hornigold, Kindred, Frothingham and Metzger."

"We have met many times each year to cope with the new problems that arise in the administration of our great game."

"We created the NEWSLETTER to keep people informed throughout the year."

"As you can see by the tournament schedule this year we have done a lot of work to keep the tournaments coordinated and to recognize the new areas of paddle activity. We have had to create satelite tournaments to help satisfy the needs of all those who want to play tournament paddle. The Mixed Doubles Tournament has been extended to three days this year because of the increase of interest."

"In addition to initiating National rankings this year for the first time, I am pleased to announce that there will be a trophy for the individual man and woman gaining the most points from tournament play. The Hannessey people have offered to donate these cups each year."

"Another important area that had to be recognized was the tremendous upsurge of play by the ladies. Their tournament schedule grows each year as has the caliber of play. In order to properly recognize this situation the APTA nominating committee has been asked to nominate a woman as Co-Tournament Chairman. She will be a member of the APTA Executive Committee and give the ladies the representation on the board that they deserve."

"What I have listed as problems are not really problems, but growing pains. These we welcome and we are prepared to deal with them. As Ned Swanberg as aptly put it two years ago, the APTA is interested in the orderly growth of the game."

"Thave been very close to the game now for several years and there

is still no way I can picture where our game will be 10 years from now. The instant appeal of the game is so great that it is impossible to estimate how long the accolerated growth will last and how far it will spread."

"In conclusion I would only like to say that it has been a real privilege!"

TOURNAMENT CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Richard Hornigold reported on tournament activities during the 1970-71 season. He noted that this was the first time that a National Championship tournament was held outside of the New York Metropolitan area, with the National Women's Doubles having been held at Chevy Chase, Maryland. This year also marked the first National Senior Women's Tournament. Mr. Hornigold reported the following tournament results:

National Boy's Doubles: In a tournament shifted from the Christmas helidays to the Friday after Thanksgiving in an effort to increase the draw, 31 teams entered, a sizeable increase from the previous year. Charles Baird and George Krieger defeated Matthew Tekulsky and Richard Maier, 6-4, 9-7.

National Veterans Men's Doubles: Walter Frese and Buzz Holloway defeated William Miller and Greg Prince, 4-6, 6-2, 7-5.

National Senior Men's Doubles: Bob Baldwin and George Schmid defeated Tad Bowen and Sid Sweet, 6-4, 6-1.

National Mixed Doubles: With a record draw of 86 teams, Joan Hannas and Kim Kimberly defeated B. J. DeBree and Dave McKissock, 6-1, 6-3.

National Senior Women's Doubles: Held for the first time this year, this tournament drew 18 teams, and was won by Mrs. Charlette Lee and Mrs. Clare Hessletine over Mrs. Ann Symmers and Mrs. Clifford Sutter, 6-2, 6-2.

National Women's Doubles: This tournament, held at Chevy Chase, drew 55 teams. Gloria Dillenbeck and B. J. DeBree defeated Charlotte Lee and Peggy Stanton, 7-5, 4-6, 6-4.

National Men's Doubles: This tournament again had a full draw of 128 teams and was won for the third straight year by Jesse Sammis III and Gordon Gray over John Mangan and Bob Kingsbury, 3-6, 7-5, 6-4, 6-2.

In the first tournament of the 1971-72 season, the Buffalo Men's Doubles tournament was held last weekend and was won by Kim Kimberly and Dave Dickenson ever Bob Brown and George Reynolds, 6-2, 6-1, 6-2.

The National Men's Doubles will be held over 3 days this year for the first time instead of over two weekends as in the past. The dates are Friday.-Saturday- Sunday, March 3-4-5, 1972.

National Rankings were initiated this year for the first time. Men's teams were ranked on the basis of play in at least 3 of 7 specifically selected tournaments during the year and the women's on the basis of 2 of 5 tournaments. The tournaments were selected and weighted on the basis of the size and quality of the draw. The national rankings are as follows:
