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CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

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AMERICAN PLATFORM TENNIS ASSOCIATION, INC. Under Section 402 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, CONSTITUTING A MAJORITY OF the members of a committee duly authorized by the American Platform Tennis Association, an unincorporated association not organized for pecuniary profit, to incorporate the association pursuant to the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York, hereby certify as follows:

- 1. The name of the proposed corporation is AMERICAN PLATFORM TENNIS ASSOCIATION, INC.
- 2. The corporation is formed under, and exclusively for a purpose or purposes for which a corporation may be formed under, the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law of the State of New York, and not for pecuniary profit or financial gain. No part of the assets, income or profit of the corporation is distributable to, or enures to the benefit of, any of its members, directors or officers, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation) and no member, director or officer or any private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of the corporate assets on dissolution of the corporation.

3. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

(a) To encourage and promote the game of Platform Tennis in the United States, and to encourage and promote good sportsmanship and high ethical standards of conduct in the play of the game of Platform Tennis.

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b) To supervise and coordinate the growth of the game of Platform Tennis.

c) To assure uniformity in rules, courts and equipment in connection with the playing of the game of Platform Tennis.

d) To furnish general information and literature on the game of Platform Tennis.

e) To encourage, manage, supervise and formulate rules for National Platform Tennis Championship Tournaments.

f) To provide guidance and coordination to the extent required to assure consistency in the play of Platform Tennis.

g) To enforce the by-laws and rules of the corporation on all members which or who are subject to its jurisdiction, and, to the extent feasible, over any sectional platform tennis associations formed or to be formed.

- 4. The corporation is a Type A corporation under section 201 of the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law.
- 5. The principal office of the corporation is to be located in the Village of Scarsdale, County of Westchester, State of New York.
- 6. The activities of the corporation are to be conducted principally in the United States, but the corporation may perform acts pursuant to its purposes within or without the United States or in any part of the world.
- 7. The post office address to which the secretary of state shall mail a copy of any notice required by law is:

8. No part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation, or participating in, or intervening in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. The corporation shall not conduct or carry on any other activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax as described in Section 501 (c) 4 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future Internal Revenue Law).

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9. If the corporation becomes unable to carry out the purposes for which it is organized, whether by voluntary or involuntary dissolution or otherwise, all its assets and property, and all income therefrom and additions thereto, shall be conveyed, transferred, assigned and set over as its voting members may determine, subject to any order of the Supreme Court of the State of New York. either (a) to a corporation organized and operated for the purpose of promoting the game of Platform Tennis, or (b) to a corporation to be created exclusively for such purpose, or (c) to an unincorporated association or group of individuals in trust for the purpose of promoting and developing the game of Platform Tennis, or (d) to such other corporation or organization, or a combination thereof, as may be determined by the Supreme Court of the State of New York to be operated for purposes approximating as closely as possible those of this corporation as set forth above: provided, however, that no such conveyance, transfer or assignment shall be made in contravention of the laws of the State of New York; and provided further that no part of such assets or property shall be transferred to an entity not exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501 (c) 3 or 501 (c) 4 (or the corresponding provisions of any future United States Revenue Law); and provided further that no assets or property of the corporation shall be distributed either directly or indirectly to any member, officer or director thereof, or any private individual, or for any purpose

or substantially dissimilar from those enumerated in paragraph 3. hereinabove.

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10. All the subscribers of this Certificate of Incorporation are at least nineteen years of age.
