Executive Committee 73-3 was held at 6:00 p.m. at the Dewnbeat Restaurant on Menday, February 12, 1973. These in attendance:

The fellewing subjects were discussed:

(1) Peter Thistle brought a copy of the registered mark, the original of which is held by Howard Kafer. The copy will be retained in the Secretary's files. The mark does not include the crossed paddles loge (why?), just "APTA", with the address:

The American Platferm Tennis Association Fex Meadew Tennis Club, Wayside Lane Scarsdale, N.Y. 10583

The U.S. Patent Office Registration Ne. is 952,444, dated Jan. 30, 1973. Serial Ne. is 360,440, filed May 21, 1970. (A telephone call to Heward Kafer to inquire about emission of the crossed paddles was without success as he is away on vacation for a week).

- (2) Courts
 - (a) After extensive discussion, it was concluded that the APTA should breaden its scope of acceptability of various court surfaces in order not to hinder the expansion of the game nationally as well as internationally. Considerable pressure now exists for the recognition of surfaces other than douglas fir 2 x 6's. This includes aluminum, plywood, asphalt, laykeld, etc.

It was agreed that

- (i) a pelicy on this should be drafted and circulated to Executive Committee members for review and agreement.
- (ii) an engineering firm should be engaged to revise our plans and specifications to conform with this policy.
- (b) Meanwhile, Peter Thistle will reply to Don Jackson and Dick Gould.
- (c) Paul Melley neted Pelham Country Club's dissatisfaction with Tournament Master's courts and agreed to ask Bill Ballard to write a letter to us detailing their complaints. We would then take this up with Tournament Master

- (d) Appreval of Reilly's aluminum court was recommended by Bob Frethingham since the court has new passed the policy requirement of at least two season's play. The committee agreed, pending official re-inspection, to the recommendation and Pete Thistle will write Bob Frethingham regarding the required final re-inspection step.
- (e) Anticipating that SMAC may shortly request full approval for their courts, we should get prepared new. The following was considered advisable:
 - (i) Beb Frethingham should request Hernigeld to ebtain a letter addressed to the APTA from the Exmeer Club, who according to Hernigeld, are not happy with surface wear and received two different types of plywood on the two courts.
 - (ii) We should seek written commentary from others known to have SMAC's courts particularly if they have been in use fer some time.
 - (iii) Brewn and Melley should re-inspect the Fairview Country Club's courts which have new been in use for almost two seasons. We should also seek written commentary from the Fairview platform tennis chairman.
- (3) By-Laws ne progress has been made.
- (4) The fellowing schedule dates were agreed to:
 - (a) Fiscal Year is revised to September 1 August 31.
 - (b) April final Newsletter issued, including rankings
 - (c) September Issue Tournament Schedule and Annual Meeting Notice
 - (d) Late September Issue Dues Netice
 - (e) Mid-October Annual Meeting
- (5) Regarding rumers of a possible tournament being premoted with meney prizes, it was agreed that the APTA would not sanction or recognized such a tournament.
- (6) Cencern was expressed ever the last minute change in dates by the Greenwich Committee of their tournament from February 24-25 to March 3-4. A letter has been written by Dick Farr to the committee advising them of our concern and indicating that the teurnament's rating for ranking purposes may be lowered depending upon the quality of the draw.

be permitted, that clubs will be netified of this in developing next year's schedule, and that sanction will be withdrawn in the future from a sanctioned tournament if the tournament date is changed.

- (7) The fellowing tournament matters were discussed:
 - (a) Exclusion of players from Invitationals is a problem of increasing concern. Satellites or "B" tournaments are one way of relieving this, but are difficult to promote and administer. No solution was forthcoming.
 - (b) Dick Farr will held a meeting in March of all local tournament chairmen who ran tournaments this year, to exchange ideas.
 - (c) At Cleveland (Men's) a 20 minute late default rule will be enforced.
 - (d) Feetfaults will be discussed at the next meeting.
- (8) Barr's ball bex-tep indicating "National Platform Tennis Association" approval was brought out. It was agreed that Bob Frothingham should write to Barr about the matter.
